Dan from our Talent Acquisition team has been a certified beekeeper since 2017 and is a member of the Shropshire Beekeepers' Association. Being Head Office based means Dan can extract the honey in house and quickly react to any bee related issues. This year Dan was able to extract a Spring blend made predominantly of local Rape Seed pollen and a Summer blend made from a wide selection of pollen in the local Telford Area. This has resulted in 140lb's of honey being produced in 2019, which equates to 280 jars of honey!
